


Clinical Trials in Vision Research: Information for Patients (20 pages)

Helps people with vision loss and their families better understand low vision. Describes how to get help and live more safely and independently.




Tips for Talking to Your Doctor (4 pages)





Used to increase awareness of who's at higher risk for glaucoma and to promote the Medicare eye exam benefit. Offers resources for finding an eye care professional.


See All You Can See: Activity Book for Ages 6–8



Standard Poster (16" x 22 1/2")


A colorful poster with tips to help people with diabetes to keep their health on TRACK.

Version 2000. Measures the dimensions of self-reported vision-targeted health status that are most important for persons who have chronic eye diseases.
